Environment

Does the environmental initiative serve as a catalyst for positive change, nurturing sustainable practices, promoting ecological stewardship and community use?



Economy

Does the community initiative demonstrate the best support towards employment and education opportunities within their communities?



Community

Does the community initiative demonstrate an outstanding contribution to community engagement and resident participation?



People

Does the community initiative demonstrate the best effort to support individuals and foster a healthy, resilient environment and a connected community?



We Care

Does the community initiative exhibit outstanding commitment and dedication to caring for individuals, fostering empathy and inclusivity, while promoting a culture of compassion and support within the community?

Who can enter?

Entries can be submitted by any Managed Services customer, community group, charity or organisation associated with social landlords within the affordable housing sector, including contractors and house builders.

What happens next?

The nomination window is open until 17.00 on 21st November 2025. All nominations will be reviewed and a shortlist chosen. After the shortlisting process, we will be in contact with everyone to let them know whether their nomination is proceeding to the final round of judging. Judging will take place at the beginning of January 2026.

The panel of judges share between them a wealth of experience within social value and the affordable housing sector. They share our passion for celebrating the great work carried out in local communities.

The shortlisted entries will be invited to attend the Better Together Awards Dinner at Silverstone Arena on 5th March 2026 where we will announce the winners.

The winning project from each category will win £5,000!

Terms & Conditions and Entry Eligibility

Entry to the Competition is only available to people residing in the United Kingdom (England, Wales, Scotland)

These terms and conditions apply to the Better Together Social Value Competition (the “Competition”) in the UK and entry is acceptance of these terms and conditions. Therefore please read these carefully.

The promoter of the Competition is Travis Perkins Managed Services part of Travis Perkins plc (the “Promoter”)

The project should:

- Create a change that positively impacts the local community, through for example specific purchases, activities or the running costs of a programme
- Take place within the UK
- Have started by 01/01/2025
- Be submitted in English as the de facto official language of the UK
- If submitted on behalf of, or in association with a religious organisation, have an outcome that must be accessible to anyone of any faith.

The entry and project must not:

- Be for the benefit of an individual
- Include any mention of specific individuals, companies, brands or products for promotion purposes
- Contain any third-party trademarks or material including, but not limited to, photographs/images unless you have the express written permission of said third party
- Contain offensive, obscene or sexually suggestive material, propaganda, potentially misleading information, or defamatory or disparaging material about other people or companies, or endorse any form of hate, hate group or terrorist activity
- Discriminate on the basis of gender, race, religion, creed, national origin, disability, age, sexual orientation, or any other basis prohibited by law, as determined by the sole discretion of Managed Services

- Involve any form of mandatory religious study or discriminate against any faith or group. Projects that promote religious advocacy, attempt to convert people to another religion, or attempt to expand membership are not eligible to win the Managed Services Community Fund, and may be removed at any point through the competition
- Support any particular political party or affiliated group
- Directly promote or speak negatively about any particular faith, political action, legislation or party, or promote or encourage the violation of any law, as determined by the sole discretion of Managed Services
- Promote any activities that may appear unsafe or dangerous, as determined by the sole discretion of Managed Services
- Relate to controversial subject matter or any subject that is contrary to the interests of Managed Services (including, but not limited to, projects that present an unacceptable regulatory, reputational or other risk to Managed Services), as determined by the sole discretion of Managed Services
- Be used towards a raffle, chance or lottery prize.

Individuals, teams and projects entered into the Competition that do not meet the eligibility criteria above will not qualify for funding and entry will be refused. If the Promoter determines that an individual, team or entry does not meet the eligibility criteria at any time during the Competition process, it will be removed from the Competition process. In these cases, the Promoter will contact the individual that submitted the project to advise them of our decision.

The Promoter reserves the right to reject entries that are incomplete, illegible, false or fraudulent and may remove an entry from the Competition process at any point.

More than one project per organisation may be entered; however, each project can only be entered once.
